## Roundtable: "Deepening Industry-University Collaborations for Innovation – The View from Investors"

The University Capacity Building Program (UCBP), funded by the U.S. Embassy in Tbilisi and administered by American Councils for International Education, is an initiative to foster entrepreneurial culture at Georgia's higher education institutions, link practical research output to industry, and increase innovation and economic growth.

On February 7, 2022 the roundtable will gather perspectives on some of the challenges and barriers to deepening industry-university collaborations. In collaboration with the Entrepreneurship and Innovation Committee of the American Chamber of Commerce in Georgia (AmCham), American Councils invites business leaders, higher education administrators, and policymakers to identify problems and solutions impeding university-industry collaboration.
